He is grateful to Ms. Kloss for allowing him to get a glimpse (for the past 16 years), into Mr. Heifetz, one of his two Gods.

Egon de Mattos (Anapolis,GO, BRAZIL), was invited to study with Sidney Harth at Carnegie Mellon University in 2001 as part of the "Performance Residency Program". Continuing his studies with Mr. Harth, he received the Masters Degree in Violin Performance in 2005 at Duquesne University.
