Nate Robinson, began the violin at the age of 5 and made his solo debut with the Taipei Symphony Orchestra at age 11 performing Paganini's Violin Concerto No. 1. He has since concertized throughout the U.S. and abroad as a soloist and recitalist.

As a recording artist, he has appeared on motion picture and television soundtracks for Paramount, Walt Disney Pictures, and New Line Cinema. In 2011, he collaborated in performances with the noted British singer, Sting, for the 'Symphonicities' tour with the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra.

Li-Pi Hsieh, internationally recognized soloist, chamber musician and educator, is a native of Taiwan. She has studied with Richard Goode, Claude Frank and Peter Serkin and holds a Master of Music degree from the Mannes College of Music. Her musical partnerships with Erick Friedman, Sidney Harth and Aaron Rosand bespeak her association with the great Auer legacy, carried on at the Jascha Heifetz Symposium.
